Consent Form- Four Wheeler

As per the Institute's policy, students are strongly urged not to bring four wheelers to campus. However, in case the student wishes to keep a four-wheeler following guidelines need to be adhered to:

- 1) A written consent from the parent of the ward, requesting the four wheeler to be allowed at campus needs to be submitted.
- 2) Vehicle registration form needs to be filled and submitted to the transportation desk
- 3) Applicant must have and maintain a current registration displayed on the vehicle from the home state of the vehicle title holder.
- 4) Applicant must have, present and maintain a current operator's license.
- 5) False or misleading information entered on the registration form may result in disciplinary action through the Disciplinary Committee of the Institute.
- 6) The usage of four wheeler should not be within the campus premises and the vehicle should be parked at designated parking lot near the main entrance of the institute.
- 7) **Student would be able to use the four wheeler only on weekends (during the city visit hours permitted to rest of the batch) and not during weekdays. In case the student wants to travel to city on a weekday he/she needs to use institute's bus facility.**
- 8) There will be thorough checking of the vehicle at every entry and exit for possession of prohibited items. In case of possession of any such restricted items, this facility of allowing the four wheeler at campus would be withdrawn with immediate effect and would also lead to disciplinary action against the students for violating institute's rule.
- 9) Entry of the four wheeler beyond the timings of reporting communicated by the institute will result in a call being made to the parents to inform about the same. Excuses such as breakdown of the vehicle or flat tyre etc. will not be entertained.
- 10) In case the student driving the car or any of the passengers is/are found in a state of intoxication, it would result in immediate withdrawal of allowing the four wheeler at campus and would also lead to disciplinary action against the students for violating institute's rule.
- 11) The institute will not be held responsible if any police and/or traffic violation case is filed against the student using the four wheeler.
- 12) The Institute recommends that the owner of the four wheeler refrains from taking other students along with him/her. In case of any accident/mishap, the responsibility of health and safety of co-passengers will be on the owner of the vehicle.
- 13) Institute will not be held responsible in case of any accident/mishap leading to temporary or permanent disability or death of student or passengers using the four wheeler.
- 14) Applicant must sign that he/she has read the Institute vehicle rules and regulations regarding the operation and possession of a motor vehicle at Jaipuria Institute of Management, Indore and accepts the conditions therein.

Compulsory

- Wearing seatbelt is mandatory while driving.
- Carrying driving license, registration card and insurance policy is mandatory while driving
- In any case drink and drive will not be entertained. The case will be referred to disciplinary committee or to the authorised authority of state government.

Accidents and Crashes

Jaipuria Institute of Management, Indore is not liable for any accident/injury occurs in and outside the campus. Institute is not liable to any loss/theft of the vehicle and its part.

Institute Traffic Rules of Operation

Any violation of the following Traffic Rules can result in fines, Institute disciplinary action or both. In addition to Institute fines and sanctions, violations of the State law or local ordinances may be prosecuted separately.

PARKING VIOLATIONS

- 1) **FIRE LANES:** Parking in any fire lane is prohibited by Institute rule. Fire lanes are any area in the vicinity of a building that is not designated as a parking lot and violations of such prohibited areas carries a fine and vehicle suspension. Parking within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant and blocking access to any fire lane and/or access area are also violations of this section.
- 2) **RESTRICTED PARKING:** Parking in any area other than your assigned lot constitutes parking in a restricted area. This also includes parking in the faculty/staff parking areas.
- 3) **LAWN AREAS:** Violations of this type will not only result in appropriate fines but possible fees for any and all damage to the lawn area could be assessed.

MOVING VIOLATIONS

EXCESSIVE SPEED: Violations of this type on campus may result in charges of endangering behaviour and in the village may be enforced by local law enforcement

SPEED EXCESSIVE FOR CONDITIONS: When inclement weather or other conditions require reduced speed for safe operation, violations may be issued at the discretion of the Office of Administration

FAILURE TO DRIVE ON ROADWAYS: All motor vehicles are to be operated only on designated roadways.

RECKLESS OPERATION: No person shall operate a vehicle on any street or roadway without due regard for the safety of persons or property.

PASSENGERS OVER THE LEGAL CAPACITY: No vehicle shall be operated with more passenger. Motorcycles, mopeds, etc. shall carry no more than two passengers (including driver).

EVADING ANY SPEED BUMP OR BARRICADE: Barricades are installed for purposes of safety and are to be recognized as such. Evading, driving around, driving over or moving any barricade, gate or traffic control device unless specifically directed by a Safety Officer or Law Enforcement Officer is strictly forbidden.

REGULATORY SIGNS: All regulatory signs must be obeyed. All vehicles must come to a COMPLETE STOP at all stop signs.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE: No person shall operate any vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs of abuse. State laws will also be enforced where applicable.

FAILURE TO MAINTAIN CONTROL: No vehicle shall be operated without reasonable control.

ATTEMPTING TO/OR ELUDING LAW ENFORCEMENT OR SAFETY PERSONNEL: No person while in or on a vehicle, or on foot shall attempt to elude any security personnel.

LITTERING: No items may be thrown, dropped, tossed or otherwise discarded from any vehicle. Violation of this regulation may also incur applicable state and local/Institute's fines

REGISTRATION VIOLATIONS

- 1) **UNREGISTERED VEHICLE:** All student vehicles are required to be registered within 24 hours of arriving in campus. ***Disciplinary action will be initiated in case the vehicle is unregistered.***
- 2) **FAILURE TO MAINTAIN PROPER STATE REGISTRATION AND FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY:** All vehicles must PROPERLY maintain a current state vehicle registration, and the owner must maintain proper insurance coverage, failing which the vehicle permission at campus will be revoked

SUSPENDED VEHICLES

Upon the issuance of the violation, the vehicle will be suspended and must be removed from campus for the remainder of the academic year. **Permission to register a vehicle for the following academic year may be denied if a vehicle had been suspended during the previous year**
